# Reflections from Our Leadership





It is with great excitement and deep reflection that we present to you this year's annual recap. This year, more than ever, we have been reminded of the power and importance of community. The tragic events of October 7th cast a shadow over us all, but in the face of adversity, our JCC has proven to be more than just a physical space—it has become a true home, a sanctuary, and a source of strength for all who walk through its doors. In the weeks and months following that fateful day, our JCC emerged as a central hub of solace, connection, and support. Nearly 1,000 people came through our doors each day, seeking comfort and camaraderie among fellow Jewish community members. This strong sense of unity, resilience, and purpose has fueled a period of unprecedented growth. We now proudly serve over 4,100 membership units—a testament to the trust and value our community places in the JCC as a cornerstone of Jewish life and culture.

The response from our staff, board members, and volunteers has been nothing short of inspiring. They have worked tirelessly to ensure that every member feels welcomed, supported, and safe. Our Junior Maccabi Basketball League has soared to new heights, with nearly 450 eager players giving their all last season. Our Pickleball community, undeterred by last year's flood, continues to thrive, with over 210 passionate players taking to the courts. At JSplash Swim School and the Sharks Swim Team, over 1,000 participants dove in with enthusiasm. As we look toward 2025, we are setting our sights on a thrilling three-peat victory as champions.

In our Group Fitness and Wellness classes, participation has reached new records, with over 57,000 attendees engaging in sessions that nurture personal growth and well-being. It's heartening to witness such dedication to health and self-care among our members. Personal Training has also boomed and continues to expand into small group training, where friends gather in a common cause of fitness and wellness.

We were blessed this past year to receive substantial donations, enabling us to refresh our fitness center and locker rooms. New locker room floors, updated shower spaces, fresh paint, and the addition of The JFit Zone—a brand-new turf space created in honor and memory of Steven "Berko" Berkowitz—are just a few of the improvements we have made. These enhancements were possible thanks to the incredible generosity of our donors, including Andy Levin, our JCC Board of Directors, and many others. Their support has ensured that our JCC continues to be a welcoming, vibrant space for all.

Our commitment to the Parkinson's community continues to shine through our flourishing Parkinson's Connection programs. With classes like Rock Steady Boxing, Pedaling for Parkinson's, and Pilates for Neurological Disorders, we have touched countless lives.

This summer, nearly 2,000 children, from infants to early teens, created lasting memories at the JCC Camps at Medford and Early Childhood Camps. The JCC Camps at Medford continued its impactful cultural change with all-camp flagpole ceremonies at Ravi's Bimah, fostering a sense of unity and tradition. Meanwhile, the Early Childhood Camps emphasized water safety, STEAM activities, and weekly Shabbat celebrations, instilling a deep sense of tradition and community. The success of these programs would not have been possible without our dedicated staff, whose passion and commitment to enriching the lives of our children is truly commendable.

The Sari Isdaner Early Childhood Center is thriving, with over 190 students benefiting from a vibrant Judaic curriculum that enriches their education. Our after-school program, Just4Kids, continues to grow, serving close to 40 students from six local elementary schools. This program provides a safe after-school place for students to gather, receive homework assistance, and participate in enriching activities.

We have also seen the successful return of our federal and state-funded Camden County Lunch Program, with close to 400 registered participants enjoying freshly prepared lunches from our dedicated JCafé staff. The weekday buzz in our social hall and other spaces is truly amazing as our vibrant adults come together to exercise, learn, and share a meal.

We are proud to launch the JCC Center for Learning and Growth, offering high-level educational and enrichment opportunities for adults of all ages throughout the year. This new initiative reflects our commitment to lifelong learning and community engagement, providing a space where knowledge, culture, and personal growth intersect.

Our Community Inclusion department continues to excel, with events like The Great Hanukkah Happening, Inclusive Community Day, and PALs Camp drawing enthusiastic crowds. We are committed to ensuring that our programs and events are accessible to everyone, regardless of ability, and we are grateful to our dedicated staff and volunteers who make this possible.

As we complete another year at the Weinberg Jewish Community Campus, we are excited about the future. Our Board of Directors has been diligently working on strategic initiatives that we will unveil in the coming months, including facility enhancements, new program offerings, and even more ways to serve our growing community.

We extend our deepest gratitude to our Board of Directors, led by President Andy Levin, for their invaluable contributions this year, and we welcome our incoming President Nancy Pearl, who will continue the mission and vision of the Katz Jewish Community Center. Thank you, Andy, for your service and unwavering dedication to our community.

None of these achievements would be possible without our amazing team of professionals and the growing community of volunteers who work tirelessly, both on the front lines and behind the scenes. We are deeply proud of each of you. Your passion, dedication, and hard work are the heartbeat of our JCC.




Budgeted 2024 Revenue: \$17,608,470



Moves with gentle, adaptive yoga, making it accessible to nearly all levels of Parkinson's disease.
